I.) **PENDING BUSINESS**

1. **Request the Town Council approve the resolution presented by Registrar Judy Beaudreau for the proposed voting district changes previously approved by the Town Council at their June 5, 2012 meeting.** (See resolution below – it is suggested the reading be waived and the resolution pass as presented.)

**PROPOSED RESOLUTION:**

**WHEREAS**, on November 30th 2011 The General Assembly convened in Special Session in accordance with article Twelfth of the Amendments to the Constitution of Connecticut, as amended (also known as Article Sixteenth of said amendments) and adopted a plan of redistricting; and

**WHEREAS**, Section 9-1 69 of the Connecticut General Statutes revision of 1958, as amended, provides for the establishing of Voting Divisions within municipalities; and

**NOW THEREFORE**; be it resolved, The Town of Vernon shall be divided into Four (4) Voting Divisions / Districts, with each Division/District having its own separate polling place.

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The **56th Assembly** District in the Town of Vernon shall consist of Voting Divisions/Districts numbered One (1), Two (2), and Three (3).

Thence the **8th, Assembly** District in the Town of Vernon shall consist of Voting Division /District numbered Four (4). (All of this Division will be South of the highway, also known as Interstate 84);

Thence the **35th Senatorial** District and **2nd Congressional** District in the Town of Vernon shall consist of all Voting Divisions / Districts, One (1) - Four (4), Said Divisions/Districts shall be bounded and described and have their polling place set as follows:

**Division One: (District One)**

Beginning at the Ellington -Tolland -Vernon Town lines, at a point which is located in the Northeasterly corner of Division One (1), described herein as the South West corner of Snipsic Lake; Thence running generally South on the Tolland -Vernon Town Line to the intersection of Interstate 84; Thence running Southwesterly along the center line of Interstate 84 to its intersection with Bamforth Road; Thence running North behind the properties on the Odd / West side of Bamforth Road to its intersection of Vernon Avenue and Hartford Turnpike, Also known as Route 30; Thence crossing said intersection and running North behind the properties of the Odd / West side Vernon Avenue to the intersection of Grand Avenue; Thence running Westerly behind the properties of the Even / South side of Grand Avenue to its intersection with West Street; Thence not crossing said intersection but running North behind the Odd / East side of said street until its intersection with what is known as West Road on the Engineering Departments map, and the Ellington -Vernon Town line; Thence running generally easterly along the Ellington - Vernon Town line to the point of the beginning, South West corner of Snipsic Lake.

Those persons living within the boundaries of said Division / District Number One (1) who are eligible to vote in the Town of Vernon shall cast their ballot at North East School, located on 69 East Street in said Town Of Vernon.

**Division Two: (District Two)**

Beginning at the point in Division One (1), at the intersection of the Ellington -Vernon Town line at West Street, also known as West Road on Engineering Department map, Thence reversing oneself to back track along the Odd / East Side of West Street to the intersection of Grand Avenue; Thence running behind the Even / South side of Grand Avenue properties until its intersection of Vernon Avenue; Thence not crossing said intersection but running South behind the properties on the Odd /West side of said street until its intersection of Hartford Turnpike, also known as Route 30; Thence running South behind properties on the Odd / West side of Bamforth Road until the intersection of Interstate 84; Thence running Southwesterly down the center line of Interstate 84 to the intersection with Dobson Road; Thence running North behind properties on the Odd /East side of Dobson Road to its intersection with Talcottville Road; also known as Route 83; Thence running Northeasterly behind the Even /East side of Talcottville Road, also known as Route 83, to its intersection with Windsor Avenue, also known as Route 83; Thence running East on Windsor Avenue, also known as Route 83, behind properties on the Odd / South side of Windsor Avenue, also known as Route 83, to its intersection with West Street, ( not inclusive as voters in this Division/District the street of Grand Avenue); Thence running North on West Street, also known as Route 83, behind the properties of the Odd /East side of West Street, also known as West Road on the Engineering Departments map, and the Ellington Vernon Town line; Thence this is the point of the beginning of Division Two on West Street, also known as West Road on Engineering Department map.

Those persons living within the boundaries of said Division / District Number Two (2) who are eligible to vote in the Town of Vernon shall cast their ballot at Rockville High School, located at 70 Loveland Hill Road in said Town Of Vernon.

**Division Three: (District Three)**

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Beginning at the point in Division Two (2), at the intersection of the Ellington –Vernon town line, West Street also known as West Road on the Engineering Departments map, to reverse oneself to back track running South behind the properties on the Even/West side of West Street, also known as Route 83, (not inclusive of any voters on this street in this division / district) to the intersection of Windsor Avenue; Thence running Westerly behind properties on the Odd/ South side of Windsor Avenue to intersection of Talcottville Road, both streets known as Route 83, running Southwesterly behind the properties of the Even/ East side of Talcottville Road, also known as route 83, until the intersection of Dobson Road; Thence continuing South behind the properties on Dobson Road on the Odd /East side crossing over Interstate 84 thus behind the properties of Dobson Road on the odd/East side until the intersection of Brookview Drive; Thence running Southwesterly behind the properties on the Odd/ South side of Brookview Drive until the intersection of the brook; Thence following the Brook South to the Manchester – Vernon Line crossing over Taylor Street, dissecting Taylor Street; Thence turning West running along the Manchester – Vernon line until the intersection of the town lines of Manchester – South Windsor – Vernon; Thence running North along the town lines of South Windsor – Vernon line, dissecting Eva Circle until the Northwest corner of the South Windsor – Ellington –Vernon lines, dissecting Wapping Wood Road; Thence running East on the Ellington –Vernon Town line to the point of the beginning, West Street, also known as West Road on the Engineering Departments map.

Those persons living within the boundaries of said Division / District Number Three ( 3 ) who are eligible to vote in the Town of Vernon shall cast their ballot at Skinner Road School, located at 90 Skinner Road in said Town Of Vernon.

**Division Four: (District Four)**

Beginning at the point in Division Three (3), Interstate 84 and Dobson Road on the South Side of the Interstate, running behind the properties behind the properties of Dobson Road on the odd/East side until the intersection of Brookview Drive; Thence running Southwesterly behind the properties on the Odd/ South side of Brookview Drive until the intersection of the brook; (not inclusive of any voters on either of these streets ), Thence following the Brook South to the Manchester – Vernon Line crossing over Taylor Street, dissecting Taylor Street; Thence turning East along the Manchester – Vernon line until the intersection of the town lines where they make a turn to the South and follow the town lines of Manchester – Vernon to the intersection in the South corner of Manchester – Bolton – Vernon, dissecting Lake Street; Thence running Easterly along town lines of Bolton – Vernon line, until the South East corner of the Coventry - Tolland - Bolton – Vernon line; dissecting Bolton Road, Llynwood Drive, Juniper Lane, Sunningdale Lane, Cherry Lane, Garth Lane, Cubles Drive, Bolton Branch Road; Thence turning to follow the Tolland – Vernon line North to the intersection of the highway known as Interstate 84, dissecting Mile Hill Road, and Loehr Road; Thence turning Southwesterly down the center of the interstate to the beginning of the intersection of Interstate 84 and Dobson Road.

Those persons living within the boundaries of said Division / District Number Four (4) who are eligible to vote in the Town of Vernon shall cast their ballot at Vernon Center Middle School, (just outside the boundaries of said Division / District, but the only public building available for such area) located at 777 Hartford Turnpike, also known as Route 30 in said Town Of Vernon.

**Division Local**

All local referenda not held in conjunction of the November Ballot will be held at Center 375, located at 375 Hartford Turnpike, also known as Route 30, and the old Vernon Elementary School. Those persons living within the boundaries of said Divisions /Districts numbered One (1) through Four (4) who are eligible to vote in the Town of Vernon shall cast their ballot (along with Property Owners assessed at one (1) Thousand dollars and not Electors of said town) at Center 375, located at, 375 Hartford Turnpike, also known as Route 30, in said Town Of Vernon.

Council Member Weissberger, seconded by Council Member Peterson made a motion to waive the a partial reading of the resolution beginning at “Division One...”. Motion carried unanimously. Council Member Motola, seconded by Council Member Peterson made the
