THE TOWN COUNCIL, HEREBY ADOPTS THE PROVISIONS OF BOND ORDINANCE #B-13-01, "AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING \$27,637,000 FOR ROAD RECONSTRUCTION AND IMPROVEMENTS AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUE OF \$27,637,000 BONDS AND NOTES TO FINANCE THE APPROPRIATION."

Council Member Motola, seconded by Council Member Weissberger made a motion to adopt the provisions of bond ordinance #B-13-01, " An ordinance appropriating \$27,637,000 for Road Reconstruction and Improvements and authorizing the issue of \$27,637,000 Bonds and Notes to Finance the Appropriation."

**PROPOSED MOTION #2**

THE TOWN COUNCIL, HEREBY RESOLVES THAT A REFERENDUM BE HELD PURSUANT TO THE PROVISIONS OF CHAPTER XII, SECTION 12 OF THE TOWN CHARTER, TO BE HELD ON JANUARY 28, 2014, TO APPROVE OR DISAPPROVE THE FOLLOWING ENTITLED ORDINANCE:

***"AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING \$27,637,000 FOR ROAD RECONSTRUCTION AND IMPROVEMENTS AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUE OF \$27,637,000 BONDS AND NOTES TO FINANCE THE APPROPRIATION".***

**THE WORDING SHALL BE AS FOLLOWS:**

"SHALL THE TOWN OF VERNON APPROPRIATE \$27,637,000 FOR ROAD RECONSTRUCTION AND IMPROVEMENTS AND AUTHORIZE THE ISSUANCE OF BONDS AND NOTES IN THE SAME AMOUNT TO FINANCE SAID APPROPRIATION?"

VOTERS APPROVING SAID ORDINANCE SHALL VOTE "YES" AND VOTERS OPPOSING SAID ORDINANCE SHALL VOTE "NO". VOTING SHALL TAKE PLACE BETWEEN THE HOURS OF 6:00 AM AND 8:00 PM AT CENTER 375, 375 HARTFORD TURNPIKE (ROUTE 30), VERNON, CONNECTICUT. PROPERTY OWNERS WHO ARE **NOT** REGISTERED VOTERS, BUT ARE QUALIFIED TO VOTE AT REFERENDA, SHALL ALSO VOTE AT CENTER 375, 375 HARTFORD TURNPIKE, (ROUTE 30), VERNON, CONNECTICUT, BETWEEN THE HOURS OF 6:00 AM AND 8:00 PM. ABSENTEE BALLOTS WILL BE AVAILABLE FROM THE TOWN CLERK'S OFFICE. THE TOWN CLERK SHALL CAUSE NOTICE TO SAID REFERENDUM TO BE PUBLISHED AND POSTED.
