C.) CITIZEN'S FORUM

Joe Tarsi of 155 West Main Street, pointed out that Rockville/Vernon is listed as one of the top performing cities at SeeClickFix; the town is closing/responding to many issues. He also spoke of the need for a graffiti ordinance.

Ken Kaplan of 200 West Main Street, commended the public works department on SeeClickFix and spoke of all the hard work done by Rockville Volunteer Services Group cleaning graffiti and trash around town.

PUBLIC HEARING TO RECEIVE COMMENTS AND QUESTIONS RELATIVE TO THE PROPOSED ORDINANCE ENTITLED "AN ACT CONCERNING PANHANDLING"

- ***MAYOR DANIEL A. CHAMPAGNE CALLED THE PUBLIC HEARING TO ORDER TO RECEIVE COMMENTS AND QUESTIONS***

A Notice from the Rockville Downtown Association was read into the record, requesting the Town Council approve the proposed panhandling ordinance.

David Howie, a Vernon resident, spoke that he has been legitimately panhandling since October due to unforeseen circumstances that left him homeless and without means of supporting himself. He thanked everyone who generously contributed and will be resuming employment.

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Mike Wendus of 91 Village Street, is a Connecticut Transit bus driver and knows of David Howie's situation, and also of many others that come into Vernon, panhandling for wrong reasons.

Dan Waskiewicz, owner of 21 West Main Street, spoke in favor of the proposed ordinance, as panhandling has been a problem in front of the shops.

Mary McCarthy of 18 Legion Drive, spoke of panhandlers in the K-Mart plaza being rude and aggressive.

Joe Tarsi of 155 West Main Street is in favor of the ordinance if it targets aggressive panhandlers, not passive, legitimate ones.

Ken Kaplan of 200 West Main Street, spoke in favor of the proposed ordinance, as he has offered jobs to panhandlers, and no one has accepted. He and his team are trying to clean up Rockville to give it a better image.

PROPOSED MOTION

THE VERNON TOWN COUNCIL HEREBY APPROVES THE ACQUISITION AND CONVEYANCE OF LAND FROM 343 HARTFORD TURNPIKE, LLC TO THE TOWN OF VERNON, OLD DOBSON ROAD AS OUTLINED IN THE QUIT CLAIM DEED AND SCHEDULE A AND HEREBY AUTHORIZES THE TOWN ADMINISTRATOR OR HIS DESIGNEE TO FILE RECORD OF THIS LAND ACQUISITION WITH THE TOWN CLERKS OFFICE.

Council Member Wakefield, seconded by Council Member Bush, made a motion to approve the acquisition and conveyance of land on Old Dobson Road from 343 Hartford Turnpike LLC. Town Engineer, David Smith, answered questions. Discussion took place. Motion carried unanimously.

- 3. Request the Town Council consider the request of Jose Correia for an Easement located at 95 & 87 Trout Stream Drive.** (See memorandum dated April 14, 2016 from John D. Ward, Town Administrator to Mayor Daniel A. Champagne and the Vernon Town Council as well as a history of documents relative to same.)

PROPOSED MOTION

THE VERNON TOWN COUNCIL HEREBY GRANTS THE EASEMENT AS REQUESTED BY JOSE CORREIA LOCATED AT 95 & 87 TROUT STREAM DRIVE WITH THE FOLLOWING PLANNING AND ZONING COMMISSION LIMITATIONS, *"THE EASEMENT BE UNRESTRICTED AND UNLIMITED ACCESS TO THE TOWN OF VERNON AND THE PUBLIC, AND THAT A SIGN WHICH SAYS "TOWN OF VERNON PUBLIC ACCESS" BE PLACED IN A CONSPICUOUS LOCATION ON THE SUBJECT PROPERTY"*. THE TOWN COUNCIL FURTHER AUTHORIZES JOHN D. WARD, TOWN ADMINISTRATOR TO FILE SAID EASEMENT WITH THE TOWN CLERK.

Council Member Wakefield, seconded by Council Member Bush, made a motion to grant the easement requested by Jose Correia located at 95 and 87 Trout Stream Drive. Town Planner, Marina Rodriguez, spoke. It was determined that the Town of Vernon will pay for the sign. Motion carried unanimously.

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Council Member, seconded by Council Member Bush, made a motion to add an additional agenda item, New Business #4. Motion carried unanimously.
