

NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING
BOLTON LAKES REGIONAL WATER POLLUTION CONTROL AUTHORITY
FEBRUARY 22, 2012

The Bolton Lakes Regional Water Pollution Control Authority will hold a public hearing in the Bolton Town Hall, 222 Bolton Center Road, in Bolton, Connecticut, on February 22, 2012, at 7:00 p.m. to consider the advisability of construction of the Phase IV Construction Project portion of a regional sewerage system to serve the portions of the Bolton Lakes defined as the "Lakes District" and the "Southwestern District" in the concurrent ordinances entitled "An Ordinance Creating The Bolton Lakes Regional Water Pollution Control Authority" approved by the Town of Bolton and the Town of Vernon on April 1, 2003 and April 5, 2003, respectively. The Phase IV Construction Project generally consists of the portion of the regional sewerage system commencing at the end of Phase III on Plymouth Lane and extending through the Bolton and Vernon neighborhoods located along the east side of Lower and Middle Bolton Lakes. In general the project area in the Town of Bolton includes: Plymouth Lane, Llynwood Drive, Garth Lane, Juniper Lane; and portions of Sunningdale Lane, Orchard Street, Colonial Road and Cubles Drive. In the Town of Vernon the project area generally includes: Llynwood Drive, Garth Lane, Juniper Lane; Miller Road, Beverly Road, Beechwood, Broadhurst Road, Anchorage Road; and portions of Sunningdale Lane, Laurel Road, Sycamore Foxcroft Road, Cubles Drive, and Grier Road, and the related spur lines and appurtenances, as more fully described in the report entitled "Preliminary Design Report for Bolton Lakes Sewer Project, Prepared for the Towns of Vernon and Bolton, Connecticut" dated January, 2008 and prepared by Fuss and O'Neill, Inc. A copy of said report is on file in the offices of the Authority and in the offices of the Town Clerks of the Towns of Bolton and Vernon, and available for inspection during normal business hours.

Electors and citizens qualified to vote in the Towns of Bolton and Vernon, Connecticut and affected property owners will be heard at the public hearing concerning the proposed sewer project.
