Chairman John Golon convened the public hearing at 7:00 p.m.

No public was present.

Mr. Golon explained that the purpose of this public hearing was to add fees to Section 8, Salons, of our Sanitary Code and explanation for the added fees to Section 14, Salons, of Sanitary Code. The Legal Notice was printed in the Journal Inquirer newspaper and also published in the Willimantic Chronicle.

The additions included: a plan review fee for new salons and/or renovations - \$100; a transfer of ownership inspection fee - \$150; and a late fee for non-payment of license renewals by December 31st - \$150. Also added was "a failure to pay the license fee and late fee by January 31st will result in revocation of the salon license by the Director of Health".

No one spoke in favor or against the proposed changes.

The purpose of the second public hearing was to review the District's proposed 2010-2011 budget. He said the legal notice was printed in the Journal Inquirer newspaper. Notice was also published in the Willimantic Chronicle.

Mr. Golon stated that the budget proposes an increase of 2% over the present year or an increase of the per capita local share to \$4.05 from \$3.97. Naturally each town's contribution will be based on the population which has increased at different rates in each of the towns; therefore, making individual town's increases vary accordingly. The district as a whole has seen a increase in population of 404.

No one spoke in favor or against the proposed budget.

The public hearing on the proposed 2010-2011 budget was closed at 7:15 p.m.
