- The Rockville High School RAM football team made it to the State Finals in Class M. - Lucky Taco, a business with its beginnings in a food truck and now located in the old Nature's Grocer location, held its grand opening on December 11th. Welcome to Lucky Taco.
- The French Social Club held its grand opening on December 11th in the former Free Spirit location on Kelly Road. They've made extensive improvements to the property and we welcome the French Social Club to Vernon.
- Covid testing clinics will continue through the holiday season at Center 375 Hartford Turnpike on Tuesdays from 3-6 PM and RHS on Sundays from 11 AM – 2 PM. No appointments needed.
